15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Our institution is affiliated to University of Mumbai and no rights are given to the Institution for syllabus designing. Institution has implemented the National Education Policy-2020 to undergraduate programmes as per the guidelines of Government of Maharashtra and University of Mumbai. The NEP 2020 implemented in the state of Maharashtra from academic year 2023-24. The college is preparing for the same. We are a multidisciplinary institute offering UG, programs such as BMS, BAF and B. Com. All our programs offer credit based courses. Projects and internships are a part of a few courses. The syllabus of Foundation Course, which is compulsory for all first year and second year students focuses on value education. Various activities related to environment issues and social awareness are conducted under DLLE and NSS (not got the permission). Institution programmes covers interdisciplinary courses viz. Foundation course, business communication and environmental studies. Bunts Night College is planning to start the skill based degree programmes.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The institution has taken the steps in view of Academic Bank of Credits as required in NEP 2020. College level workshop was conducted by the IQAC Coordinator to aware the students and the staff about Academic Bank of Credit (ABC ID). Enrollment for Academic Bank Credits 2023-2024 done. Its done as per the circular of University of Mumbai. All the staff members and students took initiative in this respect. As per University guidelines and syllabus structure affiliating University not allowed Institution for ABC, even so far we have not implemented the system of ABC Credit.

17.Skill development:

Soft Skills is a very popular term nowadays, used to indicate personal transversal competences such as social aptitudes, language and communication capability, friendliness and ability of working in team and other personality traits that characterize relationships between people. Soft Skills are traditionally considered complementary of Hard Skills, which are the abilities to perform a certain type of task or activity. Soft Skills are strategic to be successful in personal and professional life then is essential for

The departments of the college have organized various types of activities to develop the soft skills of the students enrolled with the institution. These activities of the departments and platforms available helped the learners to learn and acquire soft skills like Communication Skills, Presentation Skills, Written Communication, Interpersonal Skills, Creativity and Leadership etc. In order to improve the communicative abilities of the students the, college have start to enhance the written communication of the students play significant role. The students are given in depth lessons by organizing workshops, state level elocution competition, interfaculty debates and group discussions and expert talks of the quality speakers and the trainers throughout the academic year. These activities benefit the students to enhance the knowledge of use of language and its spoken aspect. It helped the students for their development of communication skills. To improve the Presentation Skills the departments conducted seminars of the students. The students get participated and perform active role in the Seminars. Topics are given to them to prepare and present to assess their performance. Every year the college make the organization of such seminars a regular feature of the campus. It helps and encourages the learners to acquire necessary nuisances of the language.

In the academic year 2023-2024, our institution prioritized the implementation and refinement of OBE principles to enhance the quality of education and align it with global educational standards. Online assessments, quizzes, and interactive tools were incorporated into the teaching process, facilitating both formative and summative evaluations. 5. With focused efforts on curriculum alignment, innovative teaching methodologies, and continuous assessment, we have seen positive outcomes in student performance. Project work and Viva-voce are core components of all selffinanced professional programs, and students are encouraged to undertake field-based projects.

Problem-solving methodologies are also a key part of the curriculum designed to help students tackle complex problems with the guidance of their teachers. Practical sessions in Computer Systems and Applications provide students with direct, hands-on experience. Case studies are used to help students understand the practical application of theoretical concepts.

At the college level, measures include the formation of Examination Committees, random selection of question papers and centralized assessment under the Central Assessment Program.
